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- All books are loaned free of charge but may be purchased by students if required.
- Maximum number of students in Summer classes 16. All other classes 12.
- Public Holidays 2018 – Jan 1, 30th March, 2nd April, 7th May, 27th August.
- There is a 2 week holiday at Christmas when the school is closed. This is from 18/12/17 to 2/1/18
- Courses are normally held between 9.30am – 12.00pm and/or 1.00pm – 3.30pm Monday to Friday, 6:30 – 9:00pm, depending on the student’s level.
- Examination practice and training is given for IELTS exams
- Levels of English –We offer classes for Elementary, Lower Intermediate, Intermediate, Higher Intermediate and Advanced levels.
- For all courses there is no school on the following dates: 23rd February, 20th April, 15th June, 24th August, 19th October, 14th December.

Students must be studying for a minimum of 8 weeks prior to the date of the examinations.

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Level

Course Objective

Advanced 1

Understand a wide range of demanding, longer texts, and recognise implicit meaning.
Express him/herself fluently and spontaneously without much obvious searching for expressions.
Use language flexibly and effectively for social, academic and professional purposes.
Produce clear, well structured, detailed text on complex subjects, showing controlled use of organisational patterns, connectors and cohesive devices.

Higher Intermediate

Understand the main ideas of complex text on both concrete and abstract topics, including technical discussions in his/her field of specialisation.
Interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with native speakers quite possible without strain for either party.
Produce clear, detailed text on a wide range of subjects and explain a viewpoint on a topical issue giving the advantages and disadvantages of various options.

Intermediate

Understand the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure and so on.
Deal with most situations likely to arise whilst travelling in an area where the language is spoken.
Produce connected text on topics which are familiar or of personal interest.

Lower Intermediate

Understand most of the main points of clear standard input on familiar matters regularly encountered in work, school, leisure and so on.
Deal with most common situations likely to arise whilst travelling in an area where the language is spoken.
Produce simple connected text on topics which are familiar or of personal interest.

Elementary 2

Describe experiences and events, dreams, hopes and ambitions and briefly give reasons and explanations for opinions and plans.
Understand sentences and frequently used expressions related to areas of most immediate relevance (e.g. very basic personal and family information, shopping, local geography, employment).
Communicate in simple and routine tasks requiring a simple and direct exchange of information on familiar and routine matters.
Describe in simple terms aspects of his/her background, immediate environment and matters in areas of immediate need.

Elementary 1

Understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases aimed at the satisfaction of needs of a concrete type.
Introduce him/herself and others and can ask and answer questions about personal details such as where he/she lives, people he/she knows and things he/she has.
Interact in a simple way provided the other person talks slowly and clearly and is prepared to help.
